PASTOR'S POST

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples." John 15:7-8

What does it mean to abide? According to what I can put together, to abide means to accept or act in accordance with a rule, or a decision, or follow one's recommendation. All appearing to say, to abide means to follow the voice of authority.

As followers of the Resurrected Jesus Christ, we declare that He is our authority. And in the Gospel according to John, Christ's final command to us all is to follow Him, see John 21:19, 22d. It is that simple, we are called to follow Jesus. But where? Where is Christ leading us? In a more abstract sense, Jesus is leading us into the unknown, into that which is yet determined, a future not yet defined.

Such a notion can either be very liberating or can be quite daunting. That is until we remember who is at our side. Through Jesus we profess that God is made known to us, in tangible, physical, concrete terms which we can appreciate, comprehend, and understand. This opens us to live more fully into what Jesus teaches must be our most important concern: namely, to abide.

If we abide in Christ, and His words abide in us, goodness will come our way. However, to be clear, I'm not saying good fortune will come our way. I can wish many things of God, but this does not mean that God will provide as I wish. Rather, when we abide with Christ, allowing His words to shape, guide, and direct us, we move forward into a future where new fruits spring forth, fruits we could have never imagined. Good fruits, which can only come from God.

To abide with Jesus does not mean we get it right, rather it means we try to do our best while also recognizing our dependance on Jesus to make the difference on our behalf. God is glorified when we seek to follow Jesus' commands. God is worshipped when we strive towards loving our neighbor. God is loved when we show grace and mercy first, rather than last. Strive towards these things and you will bear much fruit, as you grow into Christ's disciple.

Join us as we honor the Kindred High School graduating senior class. This community service is sponsored by the Kindred Area Ministerial Association and will take place at KLC.



Members Present: Rich Schock, Lloyd Hoffarth, Lisa Davis, Lori Pearson, Kathryn Gray and Pastor Michael Buller.

Members Absent: Rob Sahr, Susie Mathias

Call to Order: Kindred Lutheran Church (KLC) President Rich Schock called the meeting to order at 6:22 pm.

Secretary's Report: Council reviewed February 2021 Annual Meeting minutes. A motion was made by Lisa Davis to approve minutes. Second by Lloyd Hoffarth. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:

•Pastor Andrew's old laptop was wiped for Accounting firm so she can remote in to work on Quickbooks remotely.

•Contributions for 2020 were short but expenses were also down, but close to budget.

·Lloyd was able to apply for a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan and was approved for \$13,000.

•Only 25 to 30 people pay electronically, considering getting rid of text option to give.

·Lloyd is thinking about putting together a Stewardship committee.

•Anticipate being able to pay off the rest of the remodeling loan, will report further next month.

•Youth will be taking over burger stand, and funds will be transferred to the youth group fund.

Pastors Report:

•Pastor would like to meet with each council member individually.

•Would like to move pews for Maundy Thursday service.

·Go through KLC Constitution and make appropriate changes.

•Thoughts/ideas on how congregation can get to know Pastor better. Possibly questions to drop in basket or make a Kindred Lutheran Pastor Facebook page.

•Bishop coming 4/25/21 to install Pastor Michael.

New Business:

•Worship committee would like sign-up for Easter services. CDC guidelines currently at 75% of capacity for worship which would be about 150 people.Average for last couple of Sundays is 75 therefore council decided no sign-up needed.

·Creating Virtual Outreach committee or "Tech team" to come up with process to stream services.

•Bethel church is developing a Kindred Campus.

•Worshiping God through service. Potential for fall. Reaching out to elderly community.

•Suggestions have been brought to council to consider more contemporary music.

•Change meeting time for council from 2nd Sunday to 3rd Sunday of the month after service at noon. More flexibility during summer meetings.

Old Business:

•Rob has received a quote for electronic locks and lighting. Putting wi-fi locks on Narthex doors will be expensive. Doors will need to be replaced eventually. Table for now and incorporate when discussing Narthex remodel. Can use 50% of a grant to update lighting to all LED but needs to be approved before using grant. •Lloyd will get estimate to see if locks on doors can be converted over to a tumbler.

•Pastor is opening and locking Narthex doors currently on Sunday. Need procedure to have work group open or lock if needed. Possibly find manual to code lock and change code weekly. Bekki can get information to Vicki to email out to workgroup that needs.

•Need to get updated repairs for Parsonage done. Drywall and carpeting. Looking at hiring Handyman vs. Contractor.

With no further business for discussion, motion by Lisa Davis to adjourn, second by Lloyd Hoffarth at 9:22pm. Meeting notes approved by Lori and second by Rob.
