



<u>Secretary's Report/</u>Approval of prior Minutes: Motion to approve December Minutes by Justin, Seconded by Bryan. Motion approved.

• Michele has decided to stay on for a 2nd term.

Treasurer's Report/Approval of Report: Motion to approve Report by Justin, Seconded by Verne. Motion approved.

Dylan has everything up to date until December.

Pastor's Report:

- Confirmation-before the Christmas break they decorated cookies for the food baskets/meals and watched "The Grinch". Most students are attending every week, but many are having conflicts with sports practices going late.
- Christmas Eve services were greatly attended.
- Blue Christmas was sparsely attended but a meaningful service we'll continue to provide.
- A new quilting group led by Katie is starting Saturday 1/25 at 10 am to make quilts for the Senior students.

<u>Updates from Directors:</u>

Faith Formation & Growth:

- Kindred Kids-had a "pajama day" 1/5 and watched a Christmas movie. They're planning on having an egg hunt on Palm Sunday. They've also been working on the end of the year program and reports for the annual meeting.
- All Kindred Kids Committee members will be done with their terms at the end of the school year and we'll need new volunteers to chair this group.
- VBS planning has started and will be looking for volunteers to help with this too.

Management & Grounds:

- Basement toilet needs to be raised to accommodate our older guests. Will look into getting a temporary fix for this, but being the only bathroom on the basement floor it may need a remodel in the future.
- Side door with a code is still problematic. Will look for solutions and the warranty.
- Need a Plumber to check the smell in the kitchen and also to check one of the new toilets in the parsonage as it's not attached properly.
- This summer we'll need to get a quote for the church and parsonage HVAC systems to convert to Natural Gas.

- Youth Director-We'll keep looking for someone to fill the position, but will also see if there's any interest for an "activity coordinator" to help plan events. Will advertise for both positions until one is filled.

- WiFi-installed the new system and after a few troubleshooting issues, it's working great. If there's a sale again we'd like to get another system for the parsonage. It will save us money in the long run by eliminating paying a monthly fee.
- Improvements Committee-we'll discuss at the Annual meeting and look for volunteers.

New Business:

- Annual meeting-discussed what will be on the agenda.
- Nursery room-needs to move and that space could be turned into a storage area. Would like to use one of the empty Sunday school rooms for a new nursery/playroom location.
- 2025 Budget-had discussions and will present it at the Annual meeting.
