#### An update from the KLC Church Council:

**Thank you** to all who served Kindred Lutheran Church by donating their time on June 18th to clean up the church grounds. It was a fun evening that started with a good ol' fashion BBQ and outside yardwork with our church friends. We look forward to more congregational events in the future!

As you may have heard, the Parsonage is currently under remodel. The dishwasher sprung a leak due to a bad drain hose and caused extensive water damage throughout the kitchen. Gene Thompson, Lloyd Hoffarth, and I have been working with contractors and insurance. After obtaining 3 bids, the work will be completed by Handy Randy's construction. Repairs consist of the following: Replace all lower cabinets and kitchen island, replace all flooring throughout the kitchen, dining, and hallway upstairs (due to open floor concept, all must be repaired) with Vinyl planking. Most of the trim can be reused with the placement of a small boot to make up for the difference in floor height. The previous flooring is no longer available and was a much thicker flooring than what is currently offered. A new dishwasher has been ordered and is waiting install after kitchen completion. With the honey oak cupboards, the contractor will be making new doors for the upper cabinets and built-in hutch to match the new lower cabinets. He is able to stain match for cost saving of having to replace the upper cabinets as well. The countertop was thrown when Service Master was in doing the water clean-up so will be replaced as well. This is just as well since the old counter was stained and had plenty of wear over the years as well. We are thankful Handy Randy's is able to meet a deadline of end of June so the parsonage should be ready to go when Katie moves in and after Pr. Kyle and Katie return from their honeymoon. We are thankful for Pr. Kyle's patience as he navigates through a kitchen with no countertops and a temporary sink.

Church Mutual's adjustor returned a coverage of \$11,517.14; the church has a deductible of \$2500 with remaining coverage of \$9,017.14. Lloyd, myself, and the contractor are negotiating insurance coverage since the comparable quotes have been returned at just over \$26k – understanding that the upper cabinet doors and the countertops are not being covered by insurance, which we expected. We have moved forward with signing the contract and getting materials ordered so the parsonage can be repaired as timely as possible. We will continue to keep you apprised as updates occur.

Council would also like to send a **huge shout-out to all of the Sunday School teachers on a successful year!** A special thank-you to Kelly Engstrom for all of your hard work as Chair of Kindred Kids! We look forward to preparing for next year and upcoming VBS!

It has been wonderful to see so many faces filling the pews each Sunday morning. Average attendance has been in the 80-90s each week since Pr. Kyle has joined KLC. We couldn't do each week without our wonderful Worship, Music and Fellowship Committees, Altar Guild, Scott Bartram, Craig Hertsgaard and Bekki DuBord. **We thank God for each and every one of you.** If you see these individuals wandering the church hallways, be sure to thank them for all their time, talents, and efforts that they put forth each and every week.

**Our next council meeting** is being held Wednesday, June 8th at 6:30pm due to upcoming vacation schedules.

We hope you all have a safe and enjoyable Memorial weekend and upcoming summer, should Mother Nature ever decide to change seasons. Please keep the graduates in your prayers as they close out this chapter of their lives and embark on the next adventure; and for the farmers who have been significantly impacted by the rain and overland flooding and all others who have been effected by this weather.


