This is ok. In Romans, Paul reassures us that nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. There is no failure that can take us from the promise of the resurrection.

But that doesn't mean we shouldn't work at it. Just as a coach adjusts the game plan when things aren't going as planned, or a player adjusts their approach as they find they are struggling, we too can adjust our focus on our Lenten practices.

Analyze what has happened. Look at what you **Explore** had intended to do. how you can improve.

Recommit to focusing on **God through** your Lenten practice.


