Nearly 4 years since the start of the Coronavirus pandemic, we, as a society, are still recovering and healing to where we used to be and the new ways in which life will be. I don't think anyone could have thought that recovery would take this long. But as I said on January 28, healing and recovery takes time and effort.

One of the ways we are still recovering is in our faith life. We spend a lot of time searching for meaning in our lives and when the Covid pandemic hit, and lasted, one of those things that gives great meaning to our lives, our faith, seemed to fall to the wayside. We got focused on other things that were happening and got out of the habit of practicing our faith. We stopped attending worship services as often, or at all, we seemed to forget the promises we made to God in Baptism, we became stagnant in sharing our faith with our children, and we seemed to have neglected prioritizing God in our lives.

We have all done this, in one way or another. We all have fallen short of who God has called us to be. We have lacked living our faith in the way that Jesus taught us to live it. Only when we acknowledge these shortcomings in our faith, can we truly start to heal.

Luckily, Lent is a season of repentance and renewal. Lent is a time where we work toward healing our faith lives and our relationship with God.

This Lent, I invite you into a practice of focus. Starting February 14, I will be doing a devotional through the Bible app by YouVersion. This devotional, lasting from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday, will walk through a journey of seven different spiritual practices, one for each week of Lent. I invite you to join me on this journey, by using your phone to scan the QR code below.

My hope in this devotional is to remind us of some different spiritual practices that can help strengthen our faith and help us remember the importance of God in our lives. Each day there will be a devotional reading, 1 to 3 short bible readings and an opportunity to talk it over. The devotional is self-guided, meaning you can jump ahead, or catch up at your own pace. You can also set it up to give you a reminder each day to do your devotional. I truly hope that you will join me, and others from our faith family, on this journey of focusing on our faith, through the spiritual practices of Fasting, Prayer, Repentance, Compassion & Relationship, Hospitality, Wisdom, and Obedience to God throughout Lent.

The other way I want to invite you into the practice of focus is through our Wednesday night worship services. Each week we will spend time in evening vespers and focus on one of the recorded statements of Jesus on the cross. Focusing on these statements will help us to remember what Jesus did for us and how we can renew our lives in his promises. We will go through these statements each Wednesday, until Holy Week, starting February 14 with a meal at 6pm and worship at 7pm.

I earnestly invite you to join in this journey, just as you are.



What is Ash Wednesday?

"Ash Wednesday" is derived from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of believers in the shape of a cross.. The ashes of this holiday symbolize two main things: death and repentance. "Ashes are equivalent to dust, and human flesh is composed of dust or clay (<u>Genesis 2:7</u>), and when a human corpse decomposes, it returns to dust or ash." "When we come forward to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, we are saying that we are sorry for our sins and that we want to use the season of Lent to correct our faults, purify our hearts, control our desires and grow in holiness so we will be prepared to celebrate Easter with great joy"

In the Lenten season, Christians honor the 40 days and nights following Christ's baptism when He went into the wilderness without water and food and was tempted by Satan. During that time, Christ did what we do today when we fast: wrestle with temptation. Many Christians also engage in fasting and self-denial during the Lenten season as a way of drawing closer to God.

Why don't we use Alleluias during Lent?

Based on the Hebrew word, הַלְלוּ יָה (hallelu yah), meaning "Praise the Lord," alleluia (or hallelujah) is a word of great praise to God. Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent, singing or saying the word "alleluia" has historically been suspended during Lent's forty days. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations when it is given full and jubilant voice.

By refraining from using the word "alleluia" during Lent, we are reminded of Jesus' 40 days of temptation in the wilderness and of the 40 years the Israelites spent wandering the desert. We anticipate the joy of Easter when glad alleluias will return in all their heavenly splendor.
