# **KLC Wedding Planning Guide**



## INTRODUCTION

Blessings and congratulations on your engagement! You are beginning an important journey, and we are honored that you want Kindred Lutheran Church (KLC) to share in your joy on the day of your wedding. At KLC, we want each couple to have a beautiful wedding and a lifetime of love for each other.

In your planning, we hope this booklet will help guide you so that your wedding will be a joyous act of worship. By attending to details in a timely and thoughtful manner now, you and your guests will be able to focus on celebrating your union in the presence and blessing of God.

As you move through this planning process, do so carefully and prayerfully. Consider each detail in turn, and don't worry, all will be ready when the time comes. It is helpful to remember that marriage is a rite of the church, "intended for the joy and mutual strength of those who enter it and for the well-being of the whole human family" (Evangelical Lutheran Worship, ELW). While the flowers, clothing, pictures, and party may be important on your wedding day, the most important things are worshipping God and building a lasting partnership with one another. Our sincere hope is that you will put far more energy into preparing for your marriage than for the single day of this wedding.

This booklet provides an overview of what is involved in having a wedding at KLC, or having the Pastor involved in your off-site wedding. If you have further questions, feel free to contact the Church Office of the Pastor. We want your wedding to be a joyful occasion and are here to support you as you prepare. Thank you for inviting us to share in this important day in your life.

Please note that all information, policies, and fees presented in this booklet are subject to change. Feel free to contact the Church Office for confirmation or clarification.

## THE BASICS

## SCHEDULING YOUR WEDDING

One of your first calls when planning your wedding should be to the church to schedule the date and location. Please remember that there are other activities that happen in the church building or with the pastor so no date can be guaranteed until it is put into KLC's official calendar and the Pastor's calendar. The date of your wedding and rehearsal should be set with KLC no less than 3 months in advance to avoid any conflicts in scheduling. If you are planning to have your ceremony at KLC, it is best to get this in the calendar even sooner. When calling or coming in to schedule your wedding date, it is good to have a preferred date and at least one alternate date in mind in case of a conflict.

We recognize that the date and time for a wedding is often driven by the availability of a reception location. It is wise to make sure that the church and pastor are available before making any binding agreements are made with a reception location.

## PREMARITAL COUNSELING

Completion of premarital counseling is a prerequisite for the Pastor performing the wedding. During the sessions, details of the marriage service, personal relationships, and factors pertaining to the home, church, and community will be discussed. Each session typically lasts 1 to 2 hours. Depending on the number of couples being married the Pastor may choose to lead group sessions.

Remember that premarital counseling is not a test. You are not being evaluated to determine the worthiness of your marriage. This time is only meant for the Pastor to get to know you better, to help identify areas in which the two of you fit well and where growth may be needed, and to make sure that your wedding day is the best day it can be. Everything discussed in premarital counseling is completely confidential.

#### OFFICIATING PASTOR

The Pastor of Kindred Lutheran will officiate at all weddings held in the church. Where it is the wish of the couple to invite another pastor to participate in the ceremony, they should make this known to the KLC pastor who will discuss how to include them.

## WEDDING COORDINATOR

All weddings at KLC require consultation with the Wedding Coordinator. The Wedding Coordinator will meet with you and work with you to help make your wedding a cherished memory.

#### MUSICIAN

The Kindred Lutheran organists have the right of first refusal for all weddings, with organ or piano music, held at Kindred Lutheran. In rare circumstances, other

organists may play for weddings. Such requests need to be made and approved by the Organist and the Wedding Coordinator. Consultations included in the organist portion of the fee usually take between 30 and 45 minutes. If you are using a vocal soloist or instrumentalist, it is up to that person to contact the organist directly to arrange rehearsal times. Please note the organist's fee covers a brief rehearsal the day of the wedding. Additional rehearsals may incur additional fees. If using music that is not included in the ELW, the couple is responsible for getting printed music to the organist not less than two weeks prior to the wedding date.

If you would like to have music played on some other instrument, it is the responsibility of the couple to secure said musicians. If the wish is to have other instruments alongside the organ or piano, that must be communicated to and approved by the Organist and Wedding Coordinator. Additional rehearsal times may be necessary and may incur additional fees.

#### MUSIC SELECTION

Since the wedding ceremony is first and foremost a worship service, selections must be appropriate for use at any worship service. If your grandmother would not find it appropriate, it is probably best to save the song for the reception.

It is the responsibility of the Pastor and the Music Coordinator to make final decisions regarding acceptability of all music. Solos and any music to be included in any ceremony must be submitted to the pastor and the music coordinator at least two weeks prior to the wedding and before printing of the worship bulletin. See pages 10-12 for musical suggestions.

#### **PHOTOGRAPHY**

Photography may be done throughout the day, so long as it does not distract from the service itself. It is good practice to only have the professional or designated photographer taking photos during the ceremony itself. If desired, the Pastor can direct that all phones, tablets, etc. be shut off for the ceremony. That way your family and friends can be part of the ceremony and get better pictures provided for them.

## **CUSTODIAL**

The custodians will verify the church is in proper order before and after the wedding. You are responsible for putting all your materials and decorations away after the ceremony. Saturday weddings need to be cleaned up before heading to the reception so the sanctuary can be prepared for Sunday worship. Weddings on other may be allowed to wait until the next day provided there is nothing already scheduled then.

## SECURITY

KLC, the Pastor, and staff assume no responsibility for lost, stolen, or broken items. Leave all valuable personal belongings and gifts in the care of family or friends during the service. If gifts are brought to the church, the church assumes no responsibility for them. You should select someone to be in charge of the gifts at all times and ask them to be responsible for removing them from the church at the end of the wedding.

#### REHEARSAL

We work to make sure that we are ready and prepared to begin your rehearsal at the agreed upon time. Please be sure all members of the wedding party are on time and present: bride, groom, parents of the couple, best man, maid (matron) of honor, bridesmaids, groomsmen, and ushers. **Bring the marriage license to the rehearsal.** The rehearsal lasts from 45-60 minutes.

## **ALCOHOL AND SMOKING**

The Church Council has adopted a no alcohol tolerance policy on the church property. Please ask your attendants and ushers to refrain from drinking alcohol before and during the rehearsal as well as the ceremony. The Pastor may decline to participate if they determine anyone in the wedding party has been drinking.

KLC is a smoke free environment. This includes the entire church building—including restrooms—as well as the church grounds and the parking lot. Thank you for not smoking.

## CAPACITY

The sanctuary seats 300 people with a maximum of 49 in the balcony.

#### RECEPTIONS

Should you desire to have the rehearsal dinner or the reception in the fellowship hall at the church please coordinate with the wedding planner.

## **DECORATIONS**

All decorations must be approved by the Wedding Planner. Staples or nails are not allowed to hang decorations.

No rice may be thrown inside or outside the church. Bird seed may be thrown but only outside the church buildings. Real flower petals may not be used inside the building.

Glitter from decorations or clothing presents a difficult cleaning problem. Therefore, do not use body glitter, glitter on hair, decorations, flowers, or the clothing of your wedding party. Please pass this information on to the wedding party to guide them as they select their dresses.

## **USHERS**

The ushers are an important part of the wedding. They should attend the rehearsal and be fully informed of their job. All ushers should arrive at least one hour before the wedding. Places should be designated for immediate members

of the families; areas need not be designated for other guests (i.e. friends of the groom or friends of the bride). Following the wedding, the ushers are to escort the parents and grandparents out of the sanctuary. Then the rest of the congregation should be ushered out in a timely manner.

#### **CANDLES**

Kindred Lutheran has two oil filled candles that sit on the altar. Should other candles be desired, the couple is responsible for providing the candles and stands.

#### PLANNING THE WEDDING SERVICE

The message of worship and rejoicing that you wish to express through your marriage ceremony may be communicated in many ways. Typically, we use the Order of Service for Weddings provided in the ELW (included on the following page), but you and the Pastor can discuss how to personalize the ceremony in different ways. The Pastor will help you make choices of scripture, music, and service order to express your personalities, your relationship to each other, and your relationship to God.

You may want to consider celebrating the Sacrament of Holy Communion as part of your marriage service. As you are being united as one, Holy Communion also unites all the gathered family of God as one body—the Body of Christ. Holy Communion can add a special feel to your service, as often the couple are the ones who serve communion to each other and to the assembly. Discuss this option with the pastor if you are interested.

Please note that the design and printing of the wedding program is your responsibility. Please submit a draft copy to the Pastor and the Wedding Planner for approval **at least one week before you will have it printed.** 

## **SCRIPTURE SELECTION**

Two to four Scripture passages are read, and the brief sermon often will be based on one of these. Communicate with your pastor regarding your choices **at least two weeks** prior to the wedding. Below are some Scripture choices to help you in your selection.

## OTHER ASPECTS OF THE CEREMONY

#### UNITY CEREMONY

Unity Ceremonies are occasionally included in the marriage ceremony after the vows but before the blessing of the marriage. Often this is in the form of lighting a unity candle, sand or grain pouring, braiding, drink pouring, or handfasting. Other options may be appropriate as well. So long as the unity ceremony will not cause a mess in the sanctuary, you should be able to do it. All materials for a unity ceremony are to be provided by the couple. If you are interested in having a unity ceremony as a portion of your wedding, please discuss that with the pastor.

## Vows

Vows are the point in the wedding ceremony when the couple pledge their love and faithfulness. There are vows included in the typical wedding ceremony provided by the ELW, but it can be very special for you to write your own vows. Please discuss vows with the pastor and, if you are writing your own vows, provide those to the pastor before the wedding ceremony.

#### OTHER IDEAS

Forming the wedding ceremony that fits your style can be very meaningful to a couple for their lives together. If you have other ideas for things to be included in the wedding ceremony, please discuss those with the pastor.

## **READERS**

The pastor will plan to read the Gospel. While the pastor is willing to read all other readings, family or friends reading during the ceremony can be meaningful. Please let the pastor know who will be reading for the ceremony.

## MUSIC SUGGESTIONS

These are just suggestions, if you have other music you would like to include, please discuss those pieces with the Pastor and Organist.



Mileage for Pastor, Wedding Coordinator, etc for out-of-town travel, including outdoor weddings, shall be per most recent IRS guidelines (\$.625/mile as of July 2022).

Italicized lines are suggested minimum gifts of thanks. If you are unable to pay these amounts we will not refuse to do your wedding service, but please communicate that with the pastor. If you feel that any of these amounts are not enough, feel free to offer more as an offering of thankfulness.

Please note that fees and gifts of thanks are subject to change without notice. Please verify with the Wedding Coordinator and the Pastor.

All fees are to be paid to the Wedding Coordinator **one week** prior to the wedding. Checks will be disbursed by the Wedding Coordinator. Gifts of Thanks can be given at any time before the ceremony.



## MARRIAGE LICENSE

All marriages in the state of North Dakota must be accompanied by a marriage license. We cannot perform a wedding without one. Cass County provides information on how to obtain a marriage license at <a href="https://www.casscountynd.gov/our-county/finance-office/marriage-licenses-and-weddings/marriage-licenses">https://www.casscountynd.gov/our-county/finance-office/marriage-licenses-and-weddings/marriage-licenses</a>. You must give your marriage license to the pastor at the wedding rehearsal.

Application for a marriage license can also be made through:

The phone number is 701-241-5654. The Clerk of District Court Office is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. They ask that you be there no later than 4:30 p.m. to get the paperwork filled out. In order to apply for a marriage license in Cass County, you must reside in the county or plan to be married in the county.

The information you will need for the application is:

- Full name
- Age
- Date of Birth
- Address
- County of residence
- Social Security number

Bring with you an ID or certified copy of your birth certificate.

If you are divorced, you must have a certified copy of your divorce decree.

Marriage licenses are good for 60 days from the date of issue. There is no waiting period and blood tests are not required.

This information is provided as a courtesy. However, all requirements are subject to change. Please contact the appropriate government agencies in plenty of time to assure you have the marriage license in hand before the rehearsal.
