- Exodus 20:4 (NRSV)

Siblings in Christ,

For as long as I can remember, every four years, people get really aggressive toward each other, people stop talking to friends and family members, and everything gets tense and seems worse for a few months leading up to the presidential election. We get invested in a political party or a specific candidate and let polls or their words and policies rule our lives. Some people will even base everything about themselves, their hopes and dreams, into their preference winning the election.

This is a problem! Not only does this type of behavior ruin relationships, impact our performance at work, and threaten our wellbeing, it is also a sin against God. As an explanation to the First Commandment (or as a separate commandment in other traditions), God states "You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or worship them;" (Exodus 20:4–5a, NRSV).

My friends, allowing our preference of politics or a political candidate rule our lives is the exact definition of creating an idol. We don't need to, and are commanded not to, live our lives this way. Politics is important, it is a big piece of how we live our lives as Americans, but at no point should God ever come after politics, the statements and policies of our preferred political party, or any particular political candidate. God's word and God's love must come first in every aspect of our life.

This October, we are going to spend some time studying how we can be involved in and invested in politics without letting them come before God in our lives. Each week we will look at a reading that will help us to understand God's call on our lives to be part of and be so much more than what can be offered to us by any political party or political action. I invite you to join us each week as we look at how to live better lives, more devoted to God, in light of the political climate we find ourselves in.



Besides this series, we have many more exciting things happening at KLC this October. On October 6 we will be having a Bible Adventure for third graders and their parents before presenting their Bibles, and the Preschool Bibles, in worship on October 13. Also on October 13, there will be a bake sale and special offering to support a member of KLC who is battling breast cancer, and Kindred Kids will be singing during worship. Finally on October 27 during worship, we will celebrate Reformation and the Rite of Affirmation of Baptism for our 9th graders.

I hope you will be able to Come, See, and Experience all of the exciting things we have planned this October.


