Siblings in Christ,



Kindred Lutheran Church - Council Meeting June 8th, 2022

Called to Order by: Lisa at 6:37 pm. Present: Pastor Kyle, Lisa, Rich, Lloyd, Susie, Kathryn, & Michele. Absent: Gene

Motion to approve agenda, unanimously approved. Motion made by Susie at 7:00pm to go out of order to discuss Streaming Services as presented by Craig Hertsgaard. Seconded by Rich, motion approved. (See minutes below under New Business)

Secretary's Report/Approval of Minutes: Motion to approve April Minutes by Rich, seconded by Lloyd. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report / Approval of Report:

Lenten Services, Love, and Lenten soup & sandwich offerings from the Lenten season were all up significantly. We had a few extra expenses for Pastor interviews. We added a Fellowship Chair Fund and Parsonage Remodel Fund. Accounting services are working great, and giving us a quarterly report. Motion to approve Treasurer's Report by Rich, seconded by Kathryn. Motion approved.

Pastor's Report:

- Has had 2 home visits (would like to do more and is awaiting homebound list from Stephen's Ministry), and has had many visitors stop by the church too. Have had 1 Baptism and 4 more scheduled for this summer (2 private, 2 in service). Burial scheduled for August 12, for Ron Golberg, (grew up a member of KLC and ordained here August 17, 1960).
- Finished Confirmation for the year. Over the summer Trish and Pastor will go over the curriculum for next year.
- Worship attendance has dropped during the summer (may look at trying a different time/day/outdoor services next summer).
- "RightNow" media contacted Pastor about using "Netflix for Churches" videos for \$79.99/month and all members would be able to use it. Pastor has used it in previous churches, but we will table the idea for later.
- The Eastern ND Synod Assembly weekend was very informational. The Synod requests that all Congregations increase their giving to the Synod by \$500 because there are shortages that this increase would cure. Crosswords Ministry, the ELCA campus ministry at NDSU mentioned that a \$1,000 donation from every Congregation each year would fully fund their Ministry each year. A Resolution was passed for the 2023 Synod Compensation Guidelines-the Synod will put out the official passed guidelines after the Churchwide approves them. A Resolution was passed to encourage all Congregations to be truly welcoming communities for all and to commit to having someone monitor the Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service Website and to commit at least one donation to LIRS or another refugee resettlement program within the year and to partner and volunteer with one of those programs.

Updates from Directors

- 1. Faith Formation & Growth:
- Meeting with Pastor about all committees.
- Prayer garden landscaping will be done later this summer– hoping to have a large rock to say "Kindred Lutheran Church 1887".
- The Missions committee will convene in the fall.
- Communion helpers are needed.
- Chairs Fund-got a \$4,000 donation from Clothes Mentor and \$1,400 from Men's Ham Dinner
- 2. Social Ministry & Outreach:
- Meeting with Sunday School leaders for the Fall.
- Trish has Camp Castaway release dates.
- Talked about possible outdoor movie nights-need a license to use copyright movies legally. Motion to spend approx \$250 for the license motioned by Kathryn, seconded by Rich, motion approved.
- Burger stand-signup for Kindred Days-committee can purchase a canopy tent for the stand.
- VBS Aug 8-11: signup is low but still early.

Old Business

- Parsonage: -Parsonage-update provided in the May Newsletter. Handy Randy's will be performing repairs. Estimated cost of repair is more than insurance has currently agreed to pay. Contributions to this include the replacement of countertops and having to redo upper cabinet doors so they match the new lower cabinets which are considered upgrades. Lloyd submitted a breakdown of costs from the contractor to insurance, Church Mutual, to see if they will increase the amount they are paying KLC.
- Lawn care- hired Justin Mitchell after receiving several quotes.
- Choir doors-are back on but need a bottom part to stop.

New Business

- Streaming Services- Craig Hertsgaard joined. First time streamed was the Christmas Program of 2019, due to Covid it was very important to continue. Finding equipment during the pandemic was difficult as everyone was looking for items. It was a lot of extra work in the beginning but has improved immensely. Sound is VERY important (80% importance) and the sound system was rigged very well. Viewers have declined since services have returned in person but we're still reaching people so it's a valued tool. Scott has been a valuable asset to getting everything working. The youth helping to run the powerpoint was very important without bulletins. No costs to streaming the service via Facebook (had been blocked in the past due to copyright music, but have gotten a license to allow us to use songs for performances) Some churches use private websites, not just using Facebook. Looking forward we will try to not use Facebook solely but have it on our webpage to view the videos. Powerpoint takes more time to develop for services, streaming is the easier part. Volunteers needed to do powerpoint. Have a signup sheet on our website and will look into worship expectations for confirmation students and may have this be one of the duties. Could use more lighting (old ones were replaced but more are needed), shades are used on windows and attributing to the darkness. A while back, Dakota Hills gave a \$3200 estimate for 9 LED spot lights on the ceiling and a control on the wall.
- Cleaning the church (spring/fall deep cleaning) suggestions by Mike & Karla for an approximate extra 40 hours.
- Pulpit Supply 7/3- Pastor Ernie, 6/26- still needed
- Bulletins– Pastor made samples to show us, and will try different styles this summer to see which works best.
- Offering envelopes in pews-will use generic ones (have some to put in pews)

Motion to adjourn by Lloyd, Seconded by Rich. Motion approved.
