Siblings in Christ,

After a rather mild winter and a rainy spring, it is time for summer. For many this means vacations, relaxing in the sun, heading to the lake, spending days at the pool, and lots of baseball & softball. As we head out on our summer adventures, often we need to pack some stuff to take along with us. Starting June 9, we are going to spend four weeks exploring the baggage we hold onto and what God has to say about that baggage during our sermon series called "Summer Baggage." offered to us. I hope you will be able to join us for this important exploration of our faith and our lives.

After we unpack our baggage, we are going to spend the rest of the summer on the mount, exploring the greatest sermon ever preached. In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches us



not only what it means to follow him, but also what God does for us. We don't often get to spend much time with the Sermon on the Mount, with pieces scattered here and there throughout the lectionary, so getting to spend 8 weeks with Jesus' greatest (and longest written) sermon will really give us time to dive deep into the many important callings it has on our lives. Summer on the Mount will begin on July 7 and will continue for the remainder of the summer, with a 1

Sunday break, on July 21, following the ELCA National Youth Gathering, when we will bring the theme of the gathering back here to Kindred and also celebrate Trish Miller's conclusion of ministry, as KLC's Youth Director. I hope you can join us for this series and especially for the celebration of Trish's ministry.

I invite you to come to see and experience all that Kindred Lutheran is up to this summer!

Secretary's Report/Approval of prior Minutes: Motion to approve March Minutes by Justin, Seconded by Sally. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report/Approval of Report: Motion to approve Report by Michele, Seconded by Laurie. Motion approved. Dylan is busy with tax season so we're only up to date thru January.

Pastor's Report:

- Busy month...Easter, George Kruse funeral, confirmation resumed, etc.
- Met with the Community Nurse to help set up some visits.
- Finished the Boundaries training thru SW MN synod.
- Joint theological meeting will be held this week.
- First call theological meeting will be next week.
- Working on our new member meeting next week (3-4 families, possibly more) Parish life is helping with the lunch. Would like all committees to share a few minutes of what they do. Updates from Directors:

Faith Formation & Growth:

- Kindred Kids-committee is needing more leaders for VBS. They're also looking for a new curriculum for Sunday school next fall. Jessica Althoff will be stepping down from the committee
- Youth group-Trish will accompany Pastor and the youth to New Orleans in July.

Management & Grounds:

- Still working on getting electricity to the garage.
- Light in sacristy needs some work.
- Handicap bathroom needs some upgrades (sink, toilet, & fan).
- Glass on the front door needs replacing (glass had a small crack, but it's worse now).
- Mailbox at the parsonage needs to be put up and the old one taken down.
- Switched out the snowblower for the lawn mower at the parsonage. Lawn care for the church will be contracted soon.

Social Ministry & Outreach:

• Reached out to all the chairs. Pastor meeting with a few groups this month. continued...

Old Business:

- Youth Director-1 new applicant since last month.
- Building Usage-we have a Facilities Use Agreement form that was revised in 2021 that we'll review and make adjustments to for future events held at the church.
- Food Pantry-will be open the 1st and 3rd Tuesday's of the month from 3:30-6:30pm and other times will be available by appointment.
- Natural Gas-the church & parsonage are signed up and the church is considered a small commercial property. The city needs 40% of the population to sign up before it moves forward with the project.
- National Youth Gathering-Trish is going to accompany Pastor and the youth to New Orleans. She's working on booking the flights, and the itinerary will be sent out soon. They will continue to work on fundraising to offset the cost.
- Senior blankets-Carlotta has all the materials to put them together and they'll be ready soon.

New Business:

- Summer Worship Service-Sunday evening worship last year went well in June, but was less attended in July & August. We'll ask people and see what would be more favorable.
- Parsonage-toilets need to be replaced. Steps going to the backyard are rotting and need replacing soon. Fence is falling apart and needs fixing too.
- The church had lots of mud on the carpet recently so we purchased a carpet spot cleaner (\$250) for high traffic areas or spills.
- Senior Meals-would the church be willing to sponsor senior meals for 1 month? Leah's looking for other sponsors too. KLC is hosting the meals each month.

Motion to adjourn by Sally, Seconded by Verne. Motion approved.
