

PASTOR'S POST

"Our Lord has written the promise of the resurrection, not in books alone, but in every leaf of springtime." Martin Luther

I like to garden. This past winter I decided it was a good year to attempt growing my own plants from seed. This meant creating a place in our house where the seeds could grow, without interruption (which is getting hard to find now with three little ones in tow). It also requires extra care and attention as the seeds make their transition into plants. As my seedlings continue to grow, I am excited to see the fullness of this endeavor.

I believe it is no coincidence that Easter happens in springtime. I also think Luther is right about witnessing the resurrection in new growth, sprouting seeds, and budding trees. It's amazing how a patch of ground, which appeared dead, seems to change color over night with the growth of new grass, or everyone's favorite dandelions. Trees are quietly growing trees new buds and even the air has a different smell. All these small changes are resurrection moment, happening all around us, wanting to be noticed and appreciated.

Think of the power of the seed; so small, so insignificant, and appearing to be dead. So dead we bury it in the ground. The mystery of its growth happens in the dark, happening quietly, out of sight and out of mind. Life emerges almost suddenly, a new plant grows, and this plant if uninterrupted will undoubtedly make more seeds. Every plant brings the promise of new life, and more life to come.

The work of Easter also happened in the dark. In sadness and grief, those who followed Jesus laid his body in the tomb, expecting it to remain just a body. Yet in the dark of the tomb, in quiet and in secret, God was working on behalf of new life, and more life to come. The empty tomb means nothing can stop the love of God revealed in the resurrected Christ Jesus. Nothing, not even death itself. Turns out, the empty tomb, the place where Christ burst forth, changes everything. For us, Easter changes everything.

Christ is Risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!






Confirmation resumes with Pastor Michael


